From the desk of Pastor Mark:

I have memories growing up of sitting around the dinner table listening to my Mom read from her little devotion book. It certainly wasn't every night. Not even most nights. Having four squirrely kids did not make it easy I'm sure. But, I do remember a number of times listening, discussing, and then praying. I'd like to say that I've formed a good daily devotions habit since then, but that just wouldn't be the truth. I'd say it's more like I go in phases. I'll get into a good rhythm of reading from a devotional for several days, maybe even a few weeks, and then I'll miss a few days and be out of the rhythm and stop. I have a daily devotion from my seminary show up in my Inbox through email every day, but I have to admit that it sort of depends how full my Inbox is on whether I get to the devotion or not. I know, the pastor is supposed to be a good example on spiritual disciplines, but this one just hasn't been my strength over the years. My mother-in-law, on the other hand, reads from her 2-3 different devotionals every day. She typically reads them in the morning, but if the morning doesn't work she'll be sure to find another time. It's pretty impressive.

While I may not be in a rhythm of reading daily devotions all year long, one time I do get into a rhythm of reading daily devotions is during Lent. In fact, it is one thing that I look forward to during Lent. This has been a Lenten spiritual practice I've enjoyed for many years. I like to find a new devotion each year to read for Lent. Last year we put together a Lent devotional at St. Peter. It was so nice to hear the various stories of faith shared by members of the con-

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING - FEBRUARY 10, 2022

Pastor's Report:

- I've started using a digital calendar for 2022. So far so good. Hopefully I won't miss any meetings or appointments.
- COVID seems to be a never ending frustration. I know the frustration will not be forever, but it sure keeps dragging on.
- However, infection rates have dropped rapidly over the last couple weeks. Hospitalizations are dropping a bit slower, but they are dropping. Vaccination rates in our area are high, including over 90% in Grimes zip code. So, I'm hopeful that this trend will continue and we can loosen our COVID guidelines at St. Peter soon, which could include masks optional. COVID fatigue is real and prevalent. I also think about it in terms of compassion fatigue. We are perhaps stricter at church, out of love for the neighbor, as we're called to do. Compassion can be exhausting though. Ask any fulltime caregiver. Or, listen to the pleas of hospital staff who are reaching their limits of dealing with so much sickness and death. All this is to say, thank you for the ways that you love your neighbor from day to day. In small ways and large ways, we each go about loving as best we can. Not perfectly, but lovingly none the less. "The Lord is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love."
- Ran into two different members this week who thanked me for the live stream worship. They watch each Sunday. Also visited a couple of shut-ins who said the same thing. Thankful for this ministry that came out of the craziness of the last couple years.
- Kicked off Season of Creation for February. Something new and different, so taken some extra thought, study and planning. Enjoying it so far though.
- Working on sabbatical planning for this summer. We're planning for what we submitted in the Renewal Grant, and praying COVID doesn't disrupt things. Lining up pastors for pulpit supply as well while I'm gone. We need to organize the Care Team also.
- Lent Devotional is being prepared. We could use some more people to sign up. If you or someone you know could write one, please do.
- I believe I've found the dramas to use for Wednesday Lent this year. Waiting for confirmation on whether we'll get permission to live stream the drama or not.

Faith Formation Report—Jill Capps

- Confirmation During January we focused on the New Testament, more specifically on Saul/Paul's Conversion, his journeys, and his writings. We held a Service & Fellowship Night on February 2nd, the youth tied blankets for our MercyOne Blanket project. Dave Eilers also joined us and spoke to the youth about MercyOne and our blanket project. In February we will begin on our discussion on Lutheran Life which we will continue through April.
- Faith Formation On January 16th & 17th we held our 3rd Annual MLK Days of Service and made breakfast casseroles for the Salvation Army. We had a good turnout with a variety of members of all ages helping to make the casseroles that are distributed by the Salvation Army's mobile breakfast canteen. Our final total was 85 casseroles which I delivered to the Salvation Army they were very grateful for the generous donation of casseroles.
- We kicked off our Fleece Blankets for MercyOne project on January 30th. The kids were introduced to the project in their Sunday school classes. The 2nd & 3rd/4th graders created their own "commercial" for the project along with posters asking members to help with the project. The younger kids also aided in the commercial by asking for help making blankets. The "commercial" was shared on Facebook to help encourage participation in the project by making blankets or donating fleece or money for fleece. Two of our members have also requested & received Thrivent donations that will be used to help purchase the fabric. We are very grateful for their donations. A huge thank you to Allison Newman and Sarah Capps for their help coordinating this large service project. We will end the project on Sunday, February 27th with our Fleece Blanket Project Sunday.
- Lent Devotional After last year's success, we have asked the members of St. Peter to write this year's Lenten Devotional. Pastor selected the verses, and I will compile the written devotions, so we are able to print them, and we will make them available through email as well.
- Audio / Video Tech Special video & image features will be added to our worship services in February as we reflect on the theme of Creation.

Youth Report

- Middle school Youth Group met twice during January. We held our postposed Christmas gift exchange and had a devotion night.
- High school Youth Group met four times during the month of January. We held two devotion nights, met to watch "American Underdog" and had game night.
- We held our first ELCA Youth Gathering meeting for youth and Chaperones on January 16th at 7:30 pm. We talked over details and had a devotion related to the Gathering's theme of "Boundless." However, on February 1st, the ELCA commu-

- nicated that the Gathering is cancelled. I have communicated the cancellation to our participants and their parents.
- Looking forward into the month of February, we will hold our traditional Youth Group meetings for middle school and high school groups. We will not hold our annual Valentine's Day spaghetti dinner in February, I have decided to push it back to April 10th. We also have a scheduled Mission Trip meeting February 27 to share information about the summer trip and answer questions.

• Nativity scene posts are frozen in the ground. Will remove the people and mark the posts for safety. The refrigerator has been fixed. Received one bid for A/C and furnace replacement. Will look into a second bid.

Education:

• The coordinator position write up is completed. VBS supplies are in. Sunday school students will sing at a Sunday worship service before the end of the school year date to be determined.

Evangelism:

• Fellowship continues after the 9:30 service. Carol Eilers will be sewing pillow cases for the graduated seniors. Looking into doing an updated directory.

Worship & Music:

• Recommending that the 9:30 service continues until summer. Lent and Easter service schedule has been finalized with 6:30am, 9am and 10:30am services on Easter Sunday. Emily will continue to handle the choir schedule. An inquiry was made regarding the age requirement for choir. Emily has advised high school.

Old Business:

- Sunday Schedule/Covid Protocols Discussion of pros and cons of sticking with one service at 9:30 through this school year and continuing with 8:15am Sunday School. The consensus is that it is better not to change the schedule if we stay with one service for purposes of consistency. Council members agreed to proceed as there are an additional 5 Sunday School dates in March and April. The carnival is May 1st after worship.
- Updates on job opening we are seeking applicants for the curriculum coordinator and VBS coordinator positions, with stipends available
- Audit Committee report the financial records of the church are in good order and the report will be reviewed and approved at the semi-annual congregational meeting.

- Old Business
- Summary of worship plans: Thanks for all congregational feedback. We will continue with 8:15 education and 9:30 service until summer. The schedule has increased attendance at worship and helped with volunteers. A suggestion was made for council to consider 9:30 for the summer service time. Easter services are set for 6:30, 9:00 and 10:30.
- Sabbatical Update for Summer 2022: Pastor has begun Sabbatical planning. Pulpit supply has been handled. Prayer team is meeting on either the 4th or last Sunday of each month. Looking to set up a team to start home visits again.
- New Business
- Approval of 2022 Proposed Budget
- Small Miracles will fold after the 2021/2022 school year. With the addition of preschool at the school, the attendance has dropped. Currently have 8 enrolled, with 13-4 needed to break even.
- New Education positions/stipends: Youth education continues to grow. Looking to add a VBS Coordinator and Sunday School Curriculum Coordinator. A stipend has been allocated for each.

- Youth Gathering/Mission Trip: Previously allocated \$2,000 in the budget. National Youth Gathering usually carries a higher expense. Council allocated \$3,000 in December. Gathering was recently cancelled. Discussion on how to allocate The consensus was to allocate the funds to the youth group for Matt's discretion to use toward the mission trip this year or as a future savings toward the National Youth Gathering.
- Future Sabbatical Line Item: Proposed fund to cover Sabbatical planning

- The Memory Box event was discussed. This was a Silent Auction item. Allison Prohaska will repost a notice in March to see if more church members are interested. The date will be set and supplies will be ordered, after it is known who is going to participate.
- Silent Auction logistics were discussed. For events that are sold at the auction, it would be helpful to have someone stationed at the table to answers questions and share details. Receiving payment for food items and events, in addition to items for auction, is a little hard to keep organized on the day of the auction. Ideas were discussed to make it easier next year.
- St Peter's outreach ministry with Mosaic was discussed. This outreach is shared between WELCA and St Peter's Confirmation class with the effort to have something each month for people at two homes in Mosaic. The pizza delivered by WELCA is very well received, so this may be the donation we choose often. Two pizzas per home is the usual need. Sue Dooley is going to try to find heart-shaped pizzas to be delivered this month in honor of Valentine's Day.
- Possible outreach was discussed for some of our church family unable to come to in-person church services. Carol Eilers will get an updated list from the office and send the number to Allison Newman.
