# Renewal Leave Message from Church Council President Billi Brahn

Dear St. Peter Members and Friends,

Pastor Mark and Council are excited to finally see plans coming together for his sabbatical this summer. From May 23 to August 20, he will be away for a time of rest, renewal, and reflection.

The grant that our congregation received from the Lily Foundation calls this time a "Renewal Leave" and doesn't use the word sabbatical. This time of renewal for a pastor is not the same as an academic study that we typically think of for a college professor — the grant application encouraged Pastor Mark to consider what would make his heart sing. He is looking forward to introducing his family to the American Church in Berlin where he did his internship. The family will also travel to Florida to experience Disney World and travel to Stockholm, Sweden, and Copenhagen, Denmark, to worship with International congregations. Pastor Mark hopes to experience hospitality in all these places and find rejuvenation and new perspectives to share with us in Grimes where we continue to welcome new people into our community.

Dr. Mark Mattes of Grand View University preach and speak on a hospitality topic after worship. Each will be available the week prior to their scheduled Sunday to assist with Pastoral care needs during the summer. We will also rely on a newly formed care team to support other congregational needs that arise such as hospital visits (where visitors are welcome) and seeing homebound members or those experiencing injury, illness, or grief.

In our grant applications two years in a row we wrote that summers of 2020 or 2021 were "ideal" times for the renewal leave. Our plans are finally taking shape, just at an unexpected time, and I am confident that Pastor Mark and St. Peter are ready for the good opportunities that 2022 presents. Please pray for the Schlenker family as they prepare for an exciting, rejuvenating and unusual time away from Grimes. Please pray for our congregation to experience joy and support from each other during this time. I hope you will join us on May 22nd in sending them off with brunch after worship and time for fellowship.

- Met with local ELCA pastors in Johnston for worship and fellowship with Bishop Amy Current. It has been a couple years since gathering with other clergy, so it was nice to get together.
- Men's group has resumed with its first meeting on April 3rd. It will continue meeting on the first Sunday of every month from 7-8 pm. Thanks to Bradley Fasse for his leadership.
- Lent, Holy Week, Easter all went well. So good to be getting back to our regular worship and activities. Wednesday skits were good to have back this year. Thanks to all who helped with those. Also, thanks to Matt Schmidt and the youth for resuming the soup suppers for the last three Wednesdays in Lent. It was good to have the food and fellowship. Palm Sunday kicked off Holy Week with the choir cantata, which went very well. Thanks to Emily and the choir for their time and gifts. Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter were good to be back in person as well. Easter sunrise was a bit chilly outside, but 42 people braved the cold for outdoor worship. ### Faith Formation Report—Jill Capps

- Confirmation March and April have been busy months for confirmation. We have been exploring the different parts of worship & service using our Lutheran Life journals. We also discussed social media and our responsibility as Christians to use it responsibly and to show the same care and concern for others online as we are expected to do in person. I met with 8th graders and their parents on March 30th to discuss the Faith Statements that the 8th graders will prepare as part of the Affirmation of Baptism.
- Service & Fellowship:
