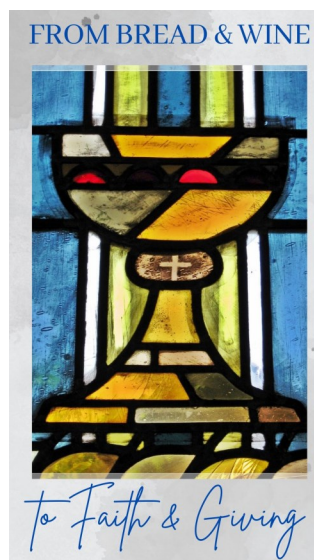

High school Youth Group will begin Sunday, September 25th, and will meet weekly throughout the year from 6-7:30 p.m.

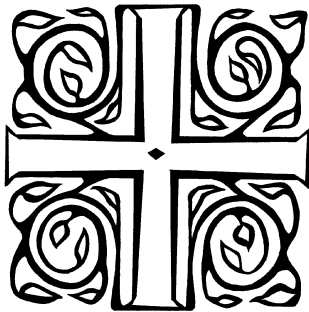

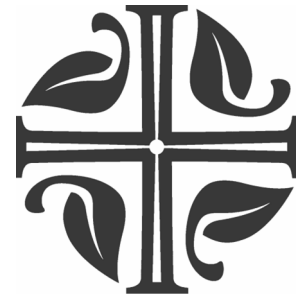

Gathered to Grow. Sent to Serve.

Communion is an important part of our church services as we share together as a congregation in remembering Christ and the new life, we have in Him through His death and resurrection. Communion preparers and servers are needed on the 1st, 3rd and 5th Sundays and the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of each month. Communion preparers may also be needed at other special services such as: Christmas Eve, Easter, Maundy Thursday etc. There will be training for those who are new to the position.

Communion Preparers: Communion preparers help out behind the scenes. Before the service they fill the cups with wine/juice, place the wafers on trays, and then place these on the altar for the service. The communion supplies are checked and refilled as needed between the 8:00am and 10:30am services on Sundays. The communion preparer also cleans and puts away the communion supplies following the services.

Communion Servers: Communion servers distribute the wine/juice or the wafers during the service. At communion time, come to the altar area and take a tray of wine. Stand on the side of the pastor or assistant. Invite people who are taking communion to take the wine or juice with the words "The blood of Christ, Shed for you." If distributing wafers, place wafer into people's hands with the words "This is the body of Christ broken for you." Two Servers are needed for Sunday services and one server is needed for Wednesday services.

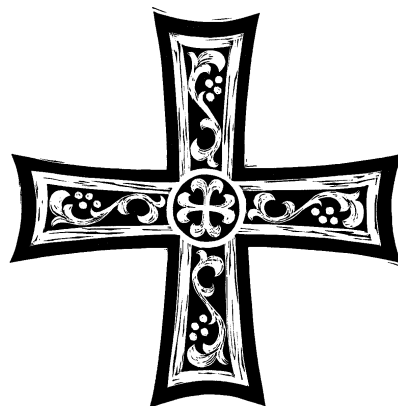


Volunteers are needed to serve as *Confirmation guide substitutes*. Confirmation guides sit with their small group during the large group lesson and provide guidance on behavior and small group activities. Following the large group lesson guides participate in small group time with the youth where they share highs and lows and discuss points from the large group lesson if time allows. S E R V I C E

Volunteering to host at St. Peter Lutheran Church is an easy way to welcome members and visitors to church. How does it work? HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING – AUGUST 11, 2022

Pastor's Report:

- No report due to Renewal Leave

Faith Formation Report—Jill Capps

- Confirmation – The majority of my time in July and early August has been spent planning for the upcoming year of confirmation. I hosted 2 separate confirmation orientation meetings for the incoming 7th graders and their parents in July. As of now we have twelve 7th graders enrolled in our confirmation class, who will be joining our sixteen 8th graders this fall. I will meet with the confirmation guides on August 31st. The first night of confirmation will be Sept. 7th. As mentioned in my last report, our curriculum provider changed their format to electronic/online materials but primarily kept the same content. I had hoped that there would be additional online materials provided for the youth since the company is no longer providing books to go with the lessons. However, I have discovered that is not the case. While I was able to purchase the last available copies of “The Life of Jesus” lesson books, there were no copies of “Luther and the Catechism” available, because of this I have had to write out lessons to go along with this section of the curriculum. This change has created a bit more work that will continue through August.
- Faith Formation—
- CFUM Casserole Ministry in July, we collected money to purchase a meal for CFUM instead of preparing casseroles. Summer is busy for our members, so this allowed us to provide a meal for those in need, while recognizing how busy summer schedules can be. We will provide our next casserole meal in September, as they are currently full for August.
- Sent to Serve Sunday on August 7th we assembled over 55 care packages for Spurgeon Manor residents following the worship service. I will deliver the bags to Dallas Center later in August.
- Live-Stream & Sunday Mornings – Live-streaming continues to go well each Sunday and is a great way to reach members on vacation or who are unable to attend in person. I have been here to open and close the church on Sunday mornings (a task normally done Pastor Mark) and welcomed Pastor Baer and Pastor Yarnell. Both have been great to work with the last several weeks.
- God's Work Our Hands Sunday is September 11th. We will have a service project that members can complete following the worship services, watch eNews and Facebook for more details.
- Habitat for Humanity we are exploring the possibility of putting a team of members together to participate in a Habitat for Humanity build this fall. In the past several different members have expressed an interest in helping build or repair homes for those in need. Ideally, we need at least 8 but preferably 12 people to participate.
- Lydia Bible Study I have begun speaking to members about getting the Lydia Bible study up and running again this fall. Anyone who is interested in this Bible study which meets on Thursday afternoons please let me know.

Youth Report

- The month of July was filled with finalizing all the Mission Trip details and doing some final fundraising. Early Sunday morning, July 24th, we loaded a charter bus and two mini-vans, and headed for Western Kentucky to do God's work in La Center. We enjoyed a great week of praising God, lifting each other up, and working in Mayfield (tornado site) for a day and in La Center with two families. We all left Kentucky with a renewed energy to go out and be God's hands in the world.
- The month of August will be used to finalize plans for our 22-23 Youth Group calendar year. There is a changing of the guard so to speak with graduating so many seniors, but I am very excited about our upcoming Youth Group year.

Treasurer's Report: June financials were approved.

Stewardship :

- Eric shared the updated Tim & Talent Form and discussed options to provide an electronic option, along with paper copies, for the congregation to complete.

Building & Grounds

- Tim discussed the furnace replacements, a burned-out microwave, and the kitchen exit door concern. The exit door in the kitchen is a fire hazard because it is sticking and someone may not be able to get out that way.
- Council voted to approve up to \$900 to replace the kitchen door lock. Expense to be paid from building funds.

Education:

- Confirmed all but one teacher for this fall Sunday School session. Sarah Capps did a phenomenal job this summer creating binders, lessons, and crafts for the Classroom Shepherds.
- Provided an update of the Carnival/Ministry Fair on Sunday, August 28 from 10am – 11:30am. Each committee will need to take a mini-golf hole to decorate and attend the event. About \$600 from the renewal leave funds will be used to assist with activities' expenses.

Evangelism:

- On Aug 21, we will celebrate Pastor's return by offering donuts/light breakfast after the 8:00am service.
- Monti reported that the July 4th Fireworks was a success! 97 bags of popcorn and 72 bottles of water were given out. Money that folks donated as a "thank you" was given to CFUM.
- St. Peter's church directory pictures will be held on October 4-8, and Monti is confirming this is still the plan with the company.

Worship & Music :

- We have the use of supplemental hymnals.
- Wednesday evening services start up again after Labor Day; we no longer have a guitar player for the Wednesday evening services. Until we find a replacement, Carol Eilers will play the piano.

Old Business:

- Little Pantry update: By September 11, this should be installed outside.
- Small Miracles balance: Billi reported the most recent balance in the Small Miracles checking account and recommended transfer to contingency given last year's Council discussions. Council approved the transfer of Small Miracles balance to the Contingency fund.
- Council thanks Mary Tjeerdsma for selling and working with others to clean out the preschool room; she will provide the earnings from Facebook Marketplace sales to Lauri to deposit into General funds or Contingency.

New Business:

- Discuss date for Council Retreat in Fall
- Fall gathering: Get to know you event for council and thank you to outgoing members will likely be held on Sunday, September 11 at Billi's house.
- Obtaining feedback from congregation: Creating a three question survey to help guide Council's retreat discussion. Executive committee will finalize and share with Lauri for distribution.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE WELCA MEETING - AUGUST 9, 2022

- Amy Dickkut shared that there was one baptism in the month of July.
- The ice cream social held at one of the Mosaic homes went well on July 13. There were 5 Mosaic residents as well as staff and there were 5 people of St Peter. We shared ice cream and played some yard games. Katie Flippen, from Mosaic, indicated they would welcome other events like this that we could do together. Purchasing State Fair tickets for residents and staff is a possibility for August. Wednesday morning, 08-17-2022, is supposed to be sensory friendly. If this does not sound feasible, pizza night will be another option for August. Allison Prohaska is going to reach out to Katie Flippen, from Mosaic, to find out which they would prefer. Allison Prohaska is also going to reach out to Jill Capps to see if the confirmation classes plan to resume with Mosaic in the fall.
- All items for the school supply drive should be donated by 08-17-22. Carol will deliver to Children & Families Urban Movement when all items are gathered. Next year, we may reach out to our communities, to see if there are students in our area that we could sponsor for school supplies.
- Adult Social is scheduled for 6:00, 08-18-22, at Kinship Brewery. The event was well received last year.
- At our next WELCA meeting, we will go through and organize the church kitchen. We'll work on labeling and such to make it easier to sustain the organization. We will draft a kitchen checklist to give members more information on the logistics of using the kitchen for events.
- Sue and Carol will visit Nebraska Furniture Mart to begin to get preliminary information on the best kind of stove for the size and use of our kitchen.
- October is the coat drive. The bonfire at the Millers' home is set to start at 6:30 on October 8. There will be more discussion about both of these items at the September meeting.
- Trunk or Treat is scheduled for 10-23-22. Sue is going to reach out to a friend at the Methodist church to see if they would be interested in having a combined event with our two church families.
- The Silent Auction is set for 11-13-22. WELCA members will continue to talk to fellow church members to encourage everyone to be thinking about what they would like to share at the auction. Gifts could be a service from an individual or group of individuals, a handmade item, a gift basket, etc. They could also contribute an item to the bake sale or frozen meals sale.
