From the Desk of Pastor Mark:

"How was your Renewal leave pastor?" "Glad you asked. © " Last month's VOICE article I wrote after only being home a few days. I hadn't had any time to fully process everything from the summer's Renewal Leave. that I've been home for a month, here are a few of the things I learned:

1. I love being a pastor! I love the interactions with people, particularly "my" people here at St. Peter Lutheran. I love being able to share the Good News of God's love amidst the joys and challenges of life. I love being a leader in a community that knows and values the importance of "Growing and Serving." It's not that I didn't like being a pastor before the Renewal Leave; but after 20 years of being a pastor,

- and the last two years during COVID, I think I was tired. Two of my classmates from Seminary quit being pastors during COVID. I didn't want that to be me. I'm glad it wasn't me. I love being a pastor.
- 2. Importance of hospitality was reaffirmed. Being outsiders/ foreigners in different countries and cultures, my family and I became attuned to where we were welcome, as well as where we were probably not welcome. We could also recognize where people were indifferent to whether we were there or not. Being unwelcoming, or indifferent, is counter to the call to "love one another, and love your neighbor as yourself."
- 3. I learned many practical ideas for improving hospitality in the church. Some simple things like good signage. One church we had to hunt around for a bathroom that was

practically hidden. We went to another church that had multiple levels and different worship spaces, which was difficult to know where to go. Thankfully, both of those churches had visible volunteers who could help answer questions and direct us, which is another important aspect of hospitality. I'll be sharing these and many other learnings with the council at our planning retreat on October 1st. As I've shared before, I think St. Peter does hospitality well; but as anything, there is always room for improvement.

4. Leadership in anxious times. I heard it said once that leaders act as transformers. They can either ratchet up or tamper down the anxiety in the group based on their presence. I learned this long ago and have known this as a leader, but having time and space during the renewal leave afforded me the opportunity to observe and process this type of leadership in action. One example was at a church that had extended a call to a new pastor, but the pastor declined. They were clearly sad, frustrated and anxious that they had already said goodbye to their interim pastor. The council president made the announcement in a very calm and positive manner. She shared the disappointment, but also the confidence that God would lead the right pastor to their church. There was a noticeable lowering of anxiety in the congregation following her talk. Bambi and I also noticed this in our parenting. When we were anxious the family did not function well. Not speaking the language, not knowing how to get somewhere and not knowing how they do things in a different country afforded ample opportunities for us to become anxious. We noticed that as long as one of us could remain engaged in what we were doing while being non-anxious, things would go fine and it would be a good day. We had mostly good days. ©





Pastor's Report:

- Good to be back! It's been fun to see people and be back in worship at St. Peter. It was really nice to start back in worship with Pastor Baer leading. Great way to ease back into things...thank you! Most of my time so far has been spent catching up with people preparing for the Fall ministries kicking off this week with confirmation, Wednesday worship, and back to two worship services and education hour on Sunday mornings.
- I'll be leading a Bible class for 3-year-olds and 5th graders with their parents this Sunday. The following Sunday we'll give them the Bibles in worship.
- Renewal Leave was wonderful. Great time of rest, renewal and learning. Learned a lot in many ways as well, but particularly in regards to hospitality, which was the focus. I believe we'll be discussing this at the retreat more. I think we talked about me having a time of sharing with the congregation at some point as well, so need to figure that out.
- I'll hold a new member class on September 25th and October 2nd during the education hour. We'll then welcome them in worship at the 10:30 service on the 2nd.
- I've volunteered to coach my boys' 2nd and 5/6th grade flag football teams for the city. That begins this Sunday afternoon Sept. 11th. It's a fun way for me to spend time with my boys, as well as getting to know other families in the community.

The number of families who are suffering from food insecurity has been on the rise over the past couple of years, and even more recently in the past few months.
- Creation Station
- We have a few new volunteers who have signed up to help staff creation station on Sunday mornings.
- Soundboard Wednesday
- I have a couple new volunteers who will help run the soundboard on Wednesday evenings. This will help ease my Wednesday schedule, so that I do not have to rush from confirmation to get the service started. This also will allow Sue to help with the music on Wednesday nights, as she had often helped with soundboard on Wednesday evenings.
- Live stream Sunday
- With our return to two services, we will live-stream our 8:00 service only. The service will remain online so that it can be viewed at the time that works best for our online viewers.

Youth Report

- During the month of August, we continued to meet for Youth Group on Sunday nights in the Church parking lot. It was a collection of middle and high school students who wanted to continue to meet up to hang out.
- With the Youth Group calendar finalized, I am looking forward our Youth Group kick-off on Sunday September 18th. This event is for both the middle and high school groups. High school will continue to meet on Sunday night throughout the Youth Group calendar year.

• We will have our first middle school Youth Group on Wednesday, September 21st. Our Youth Group calendar will follow the same schedule as last year with the middle school meeting the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month.

Treasurer's Report: July financials reviewed and approved

Stewardship:

• September 18th is the kick-off for the stewardship campaign and the committee is distributing an online time & talent sheet for the first time; Oct 9th is the pledge drive/Celebration Sunday.

Building & Grounds

- The door lock has been replaced for the door off the kitchen and eliminated the fire hazard since it was sticking
 on the inside. The code is different and will be distributed to the staff, Council and heads of committees or other
 groups as needed.
- The new furnace & A/C was installed the first week of September for the unit that controls the staff offices temperature; the church has signed a maintenance contract again with AirCon.
- Todd is going to dig the hole for the little pantry on Sept 9th; the committee is continuing to think about tree replanting. The Committee will speak with others in the congregation who asked to help and Eagle Scouts who may be able to plant for a project.
- Some church light bulbs were replaced today and others will be followed-up on.
- Nativity stable needs to be replaced (wasn't used last year) and some characters have damage from last year. This is another possible Eagle Scout project or Tim could build something if ideas are presented to him.
- Garage door is broken and rollers are out of tracks. Overhead Door says springs and cables broken they provided a quote and Tim is getting a second quote. Council approved a motion to approve up to \$3000 to come out of the Building Fund to purchase a new garage door.

Education:

- Katie Murano is going to send around a sign-up for responsibility for filling the little pantry; Sunday School is going to find a volunteer class or committee each month to check the supply.
- Sunday School starts this Sunday and volunteers for 3rd/4th grade were received through November via Sign-up Genius. For the 7th/8th grade class, 1st Sunday of the month is devotional time; asking for their help in younger classrooms.

Evangelism:

- Monti reported that the July 4th Fireworks was a success! 97 bags of popcorn and 72 bottles of water were given out. Money that folks donated as a "thank you" was given to CFUM.
- Church Directory pictures are scheduled for Oct 5-8th, 2-8:30pm; Saturday 10-4pm; the committee is seeking church volunteers to welcome people.
- Fall clean-up planning is coming up and Monti is looking into the City's fall clean-up date. Celebration Sunday Oct. 9th they are planning on lunch options. Oct. 2nd new member Sunday and cake to be ordered. City will use our parking lot on Oct. 8th and we will have some reserved spots for the church directory photos.
