From the Desk of Pastor *Mark*:

On Saturday, October 1st, the church council met for its annual planning retreat. I truly enjoy this time with the church council each year. Yes, giving up most of a Saturday can be challenging; but that is also what is inspiring for me. I'm inspired by the many leaders that volunteer their time and are passionate about helping ensure that the Gospel is being shared to its fullest potential at St. Peter.

There are mainly two objectives to the retreat each year. First objective is for the council members to get to know one another a little better. Every August there are 4-5 new council members that begin their three year term. Ice breakers, small group discussions, and eating lunch together offers a more relaxed opportunity for the council to get to know one another. Good relationships can help foster healthy and creative discussions throughout the year as the church council furthers the mission of the church.

The second objective of the council retreat is for brainstorming and visioning for the church and it's future. This year's visioning focused on two areas. The first was on processing the feedback received from the congregation. (Thank you to those who took time to share your feedback. It is much appreciated.) The second focus for visioning was on hospitality. I shared some of the things I learned about hospitality on my Renewal Leave and council members shared some of their experiences. Together we discussed ways that we could build on the hospitality that St. Peter already shows. Here are some things that were discussed, and action items moving forward:

- Council will look at ways to incorporate some more adult ministries in the coming year.
- 2. Building on hospitality at St. Peter:
- Identifying and connecting with visitors. Pastor and council will be intentional about spotting visitors and connecting with them. The whole congregation can help with this as well by introducing yourself if you see someone you don't know. They may be a visitor or they may be a long time member. Either way you've made a new connection, and you've demonstrated a wonderful aspect of hospitality by helping them be seen/noticed.
- Worship accessibility and understanding for visitors. Have clear instructions in the bulletin and/or pointed out by the pastor, so we don't assume everyone knows what is going on. Such as communion, quarter tube, or creation station. Pastor and council will work on this.
- Improve signage at the church. Such as coffee time, restrooms, entrance, etc. Council will work on this.
- Website: welcome video introducing visitors to the church and what to expect if they come to worship. Pastor will work on this.
- Book study and discussion with the whole congregation on hospitality. This is already planned for a three week discussion on the book Becoming a Welcoming Church. Books have been ordered with money from the Renewal Leave grant. I will lead the discussions on Wednesday's following worship on Nov. 30th, Dec. 7 & 10th; and I will also lead discussions during Sunday education hour on Dec. 4, 11, 18. Please pick up a book, and join us for a discussion if you are able.

We just welcomed 5 new families that are excited about being a part of this wonderful community of faith we call St. Peter Lutheran Church. St. Peter is already doing amazing work for God's Kingdom. Focusing on some new adult ministries and building on the hospitality St. Peter already provides can only help to further our mission together. Gathered to Grow...Sent to Serve.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING - OCTOBER 1, 2022

Pastor's Report:

- It is a joy to have 5 families joining St. Peter tomorrow
- September involved funeral planning with 3 families Miles Fredericks funeral on Saturday, Sept 24; Gloria Brewer on Thursday, Sept 29; and Jo Tosh's funeral to be scheduled in November
- Pastor attended the Synod conference in Coralville with the Bishop from Sun 25th-Tuesday 27th good to catch up with other leaders in the Synod after a couple years being virtual.

Faith Formation Report—Jill Capps

- Confirmation
- Our first night of confirmation was on September 7th. This year we have 13 7th graders and 16 8th graders. We have spent the past few weeks learning about the Life of Martin Luther & the history of the Reformation.
- On October 22nd we will hold our confirmation retreat at St. Peter. This year the youth will prepare a worship service for Wednesday, October 26th. The youth will plan the entire service and will focus on the Reformation in recognition of Reformation Sunday on October 30th. The youth will also participate in our 4th Annual Amazing gRace around Grimes and complete a service project focusing on the homeless & food insecure populations in the Des Moines metro.
- Faith Formation: God's Work Our Hands Sunday, Sept 11th We prepared 56 birthday boxes, 15 of those were
 given to the Grimes Storehouse and 41 were delivered to the Urbandale Food Pantry. Birthday boxes provide
 the essentials for a birthday celebration for the children whose families depend on these organizations. Families
 who are suffering from food insecurity are on the rise over the past couple of years, and even more recently in
 the past few months.
- Creation Station: Creation station continues to be well attended; we are even exceeding pre-Covid numbers on
 most Sunday mornings. We have had a few new volunteers who have signed up to help staff creation station on
 Sunday mornings.
- Soundboard—Wednesday: Special thanks to Joe Johnston & Family, and Amy Short for stepping in to run the soundboard on Wednesday evenings for worship.
- Livestream—Sunday: With our return to two services, we will livestream our 8:00 services only. The service will remain online so that it can be viewed a the time that works best for our online viewers.

Youth Report

- September kicked off our Youth Group calendar year. This year we had a combined bar-b-q kickoff event for the middle and high school Youth Groups on September 18th. It was a perfect night and we had over 35 youth in attendance.
- Due to a schedule conflict, I pushed back our Middle school Youth Group will kick off on Wednesday, October 5th. We will share a snack, play some games and talk about our upcoming year. I am excited to get the group back together and have some fun.
- High school Youth Group met twice in September. We talked about the upcoming year and planned some of our outings and meal nights.
- October will be a month filled with traditional Youth Group activities, Trunk-or-Treat, and Fall Outreach.

Building & Grounds

- Installed the Little Pantry
- Less garage door expense than anticipated and still working to get someone for more minor repair after a spring broke.

• Insecticide on some trees in the back doesn't seem to be working, so we will have more trees to take down in 2023. The Committee is continuing to investigate options for a few trees to replace.

Education:

- Council members reported that the Little Pantry is being used and has been empty at various times. Katie Murano is using SignUp Genius to get 2-week increments for volunteers to fill the Little Pantry, and Committee is looking into other outside service groups that want to fill for a 2-week period. Members' donations to the Grimes Storehouse at St. Peter could also be used to fill the Little Pantry. Discussion of a small food drive around Thanksgiving and specifying types of items that could be saved for the Little Pantry over the winter.
- The committee is continuing to look for volunteers to help with Sunday School classrooms esp. when regular volunteers are out of town; volunteers are reporting how easy it is to show-up with the curriculum that Sarah Capps prepared over the summer! Special thanks to Sarah for her commitment to this new curriculum coordinator role! Additionally, the youth volunteers have also been very helpful to the Sunday School teachers.
- Committee will review hours that both Sarah and Katie put into their two roles since the roles were new in 2022 and that will help Council evaluate the budget for these positions in 2023.

Evangelism:

- Sheet cakes ordered for Oct. 2nd's New Member Sunday.
- Planned luncheon from HyVee for Oct. 9th Celebration Sunday.
- Oct 30th is fall clean-up there will be pizza served afterwards, and Monti is calling folks whose homes may need clean-up.
- Church Directory pictures start next week. Rob & Monti will collect photos for our homebound members.

Worship & Music:

- Two services structure is going well and the choir participation has been good.
- Wednesday services Since we do not have a guitarist yet this fall, the Committee is using pre-recorded music on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays and 2nd is Holden Prayer Service and 4th Sunday is volunteer worship leader and pianist (currently Sue Dooley and Carol Eilers). Jill is following up on purchasing the copyrights to videos for the music on the 1st and 3rd Wednesday services through CCLI and Loop Community.
- The first Sunday of Advent is November 27th and the Cantata is planned for Dec. 18. Christmas Eve services will be 4pm, 6pm and 9pm with the 4pm service live-streamed. There will be a Christmas morning worship service since the 25th is a Sunday.
- The committee continues to reach out to volunteers for many worship spots.
