### HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING - NOVEMBER 10, 2022

### Pastor's Report:

- It was a joy to welcome five new families joining St. Peter on October 2nd.
- Family Bonfire was a good fellowship event on the 8th. Thanks to the Miller's for hosting the event. That was a mighty big bonfire.
- Celebration Sunday went well on October 9th. Good turnout for worship and luncheon afterward.
- A number of kids had their first communion instruction with me and their parents on Sunday, October 9th, and then had their first communion in worship on the 16th.
- Confirmation retreat was on October 22nd. It was an all day Saturday event from 9am to 8pm. Event went well thanks to Jill's leadership, and the volunteer adult leaders. Kids did a great job staying engaged for a full day as well. The topic of the retreat was worship. The youth broke up into groups to put together a worship service. On Wednesday, October 26th, they led the worship service, and did a great job.
- I left the retreat for a couple hours to officiate a wedding. Congratulations Danielle and Kevin!
- Last Wednesday I baptized two brothers who are in the Confirmation ministry. Aaden and Isaac did not grow up in the church. Friends invited them to confirmation and youth group.
- We will have another baptism on Sunday, Nov. 20th, for a young child.
- There will be no worship on Wednesday, November 23rd, due to Thanksgiving. We've tried having worship the day before Thanksgiving in the past and only those who were helping lead worship were present.
- Lines are newly painted in the parking lot. Thank you, Todd Pugh!
- I plan on leading a hospitality discussion around the book Becoming a Welcoming Church by Thom Rainer. Three Wednesday's: Nov. 30, Dec. 7 & 14. Three Sunday's during education hour: Dec. 4, 11, 18. Executive committee has also decided to use this same book for our council opening discussions. I'll bring the books to council this Thursday.

### Faith Formation Report—Jill Capps

- Confirmation
- On October 22nd we held our confirmation retreat at St. Peter. The youth spent the morning preparing an entire worship service that they shared with the congregation on Wednesday, October 26th. The youth did a great job, and the service was enjoyed by all. The youth also participated in our 4th Annual Amazing gRace around Grimes. A special thank you to the St. Peter members who hosted a stop on the race: the Fasse, Ridnour, Jackson, Johnston, Scholl, Capps, Hughes, Short, and Schmidt families. The youth also baked muffins for fellowship on Sunday, Oct 23rd, and prepared a few breakfast casseroles for the Salvation Army Mobile Breakfast canteen.
- The youth are continuing the study of Martin Luther & the small catechism. They will also begin to prepare for the Wednesday, December 14th, worship service where they will present the Christmas story.
- As part of our confirmation "together we can "change" the world" program, the youth collected \$42.34 for the Myamba confirmation program. In November & December the youth will focus on a project with the Grimes Storehouse where they will collect items for breakfast (pancake mix, syrup & juice), personal care items and fill stockings for the children whose families receive assistance from the Grimes Storehouse.
- Faith Formation
- We will hold our 2nd Annual Gingerbread House build on Sunday, December 4th, following the 10:30am worship service.
- The Thursday afternoon Bible study began meeting in October. We currently plan to meet the 2nd Thursday of each month, although we may increase that to two times a month. We have begun our study with the book of Proverbs.
- Creation Station: Creation station continues to be well attended; we consistently see numbers equal to or greater than our pre-covid participation.
- Soundboard Wednesday: Special thanks to Joe Johnston & Family, and Amy Short for stepping in to run the soundboard on Wednesday evenings for worship.

• Live stream - Sunday: The live-stream service continues to be offered at 8:00am services. We continue to have a steady number of people who view the service online regularly or when they are unable to attend in person.

### **Youth Report**

- Middle school Youth Group met twice during the month of October. During our Youth Group time we had devotions, shared in some snacks, and played some games.
- High school Youth Group met five times during the month of October. We held two devotion nights, had a meal night, carved pumpkins and went to a haunted house.
- Our youth also assisted with Truck or Treat on 11/23, and Fall Outreach on 11/30.
- November will be a month filled with traditional Youth Group activities, a mission trip informational meeting and Friendsgiving for our high schoolers.

### Treasurer's Report: September financials approved

- Billi reported that Timmins, Jacobsen & Strawhacker, LLP is assisting our church with reviewing financial data for the Employee Retention Credit, and we have one quarter that we are eligible for, so Lauri will provide further information from payroll taxes to the firm
- Billi reported that Lauri is working with she and Pastor Mark to finish up accounting on Lilly Endowment Clergy Renewal grant funds to allocate all expenses and pay out in 2022; they will report the details to the committee that completed the grant application.

### Stewardship:

- The pledge drive is down about \$10,000 from last year, but up about \$20,000 from 2020 and members can continue to submit pledges, so hopefully we'll hit a similar number to last year.
- Online time and talent sheets were not as popular as expected, and most people chose to continue to do the paper sheets again with a good overall response.
- The committee will investigate CD rates again and confirm the next maturities given significant interest rate increases.

#### **Building & Grounds**

- Food pantry door will be re-done soon and re-attached.
- The committee will look at light bulb replacements in the sanctuary after our meeting.
- The new furnace created smoke one evening and the fire department came out. It was a fan heating up and didn't create smoke damage. It is fixed and working - thanks to those who aired out the church and waited out the situation.
- Discussed and agreed with continuing with Ground Forces for snow removal.
- For Christmas the committee will put up the Christmas tree and star around the Nov. 20th before Advent begins. Tim has been looking at possible new designs for a smaller outdoor nativity that he could build since a storm did significant damage to the old pieces last year.
- Todd is working on the garage door repairs.

### **Education:**

- Christmas program is Dec. 11th at the 10:30 service
- The leaders are looking for Sunday School teachers, particularly in the 3rd/4th grade room on certain Sundays for the 2nd semester.
- We discussed using the Service area bulletin board and counter in the Fellowship Hall where sign-ups, display of projects, etc. could be done. The committee will talk with Jill about what she needs for on-going space too.
- It has been advantageous this year to have Katie Murano and Sarah Capps in these new education positions and Council is so grateful for how the ministries are going and the time and enthusiasm they bring to the roles. The Committee will propose stipends for these positions again in 2023 due to the great value they provided.

### **Evangelism:**

- Trying to meet with photographer in late November to discuss getting a few more pictures taken or submitted.
- Celebration Sunday went well and food was provided.
- For Fall clean-up coordination, there were 5 houses we worked on; the people at the homes were very appreciative and it continues to be a great intergenerational service activity.

### Worship & Music:

- The sanctuary will be decorated on 11/20 and WELCA Is helping the committee with this project.
- Christmas Cantata is the 18th at both worship services.

- Use and set up of multi-purpose room need a paint color and possible repair on walls; Todd will work on a muli-purpose room sign; others to talk with possible volunteers for painting and we may need the paint color for other rooms within the church for consistency.
- Council retreat follow-up
- Congregational Feedback focused on the need for small group ministries for adults:
- Empty Nester group to revitalize? Monti is reaching out to a member who participated last time and we welcome other volunteers who may want to lead or participate in re-gathering this group again.
- Adult Education: We will see how participation goes for Jill's leadership of a Bible study on the 2nd Thursday of the month at 1pm plus Pastor's leadership for the book study in Advent.
- Couples/dinner group: Looking for a date in the new year to try this connection opportunity again as all agreed we couldn't start this up with the holidays approaching.
- Action items on a hospitality discussion:
- Training for host role discussing having a veteran host lead new volunteers so they work together; discussing a video training and may email the instructions to hosts with their reminder each week.
- Discussion on a training for communion assistants depending on new volunteers in the time and talent sheets
- Executive Committee drafted some additional explanations for the bulletin relating to the quarter tube, creation station and the availability of the nursery.
- Pastor to make a brief welcoming video to walk through the church with Jill soon
- Council Basket for WELCA auction: Thanks to Andrew for gathering the items for the smoked meat basket for Council to contribute to for Sunday's silent auction!

#### **New Business:**

Church nursery - A member reached out this fall to volunteer to look for a new paid nursery staff member. Council discussed the Child Safe Policy of the church, the ways we are currently asking our high school youth to volunteer for Sunday School, and the need to consistently staff the nursery and provide back-up adults to help if we commit to this. Given the robust participation in Creation Station and need for more volunteers there, plus the

previous difficulty of finding qualified people for the nursery at our wage-range, we have decided not to pursue this position for the time being.

• Committee allocations need to be reviewed for the December budget meeting.

### HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE WELCA MEETING - NOVEMBER 1, 2022

- The Trunk or Treat held on Sunday, October 23, was successful with an estimated 275 people attending. There were 25 trunks provided by our church and the Grimes United Methodist Church family. Both churches are in favor of doing it together again next year. The wind prevented the planned bounce house. It seemed that was not a big drawback because there was plenty of other things for the children to enjoy. We also discussed that it may have been hard for the children to use while in costume. We ran out of popcorn and we were able to switch to treats left over from VBS and the confirmation retreat. Next year, we will plan tasks for volunteers more specifically. For instance, it would have been easier to have a couple more people at the parking lot entrance to direct cars.
- Several names were brought up as church members that might be interested in joining the WELCA board. Current board members will reach out in the coming weeks.
- The coat and sleeping bag drive is during the month of October. St Peter families can drop off donations at the church. All items collected will be delivered to the Clothes Closet at Capitol Hill Lutheran church after church on Wednesday, November 2.
- Plans were discussed for the Silent Auction, set for November 13. There will be a bake sale, soup-in-a-jar, and a freezer meal sale in addition to Silent Auction items. WELCA members will meet Friday, November 11, to assembler items in the all-purpose room. Set up in the fellowship hall will not begin until after the memorial service on Saturday, November 12.
- The Giving Tree can be set up anytime after church on Sunday, November 20. Available WELCA members will meet on the morning of Wednesday, November 23, to set up and decorate the tree. St Peter will be given 80 tie tags with gifts described. Church family members can select a tag, purchase the item and return them gift wrapped or in gift bags. WELCA will meet to prepare for pick up on December 5 by the organizers.
- Ideas for end-of-the-year donations by WELCA were discussed. Decisions will be made at the December meeting.
