From the Desk of Pastor Mark:

Happy New Year! The year 2022 is now behind us, and we say hello 2023. With that in mind, let's begin by looking back at the ministry of St. Peter Lutheran Church in 2022. The year 2022 began still under the fog of the COVID pandemic. None the less, St. Peter continued to move forward in its mission and ministry. Here are a few things for reflection and celebration, as we look back St. Peter's mission and ministries in 2022:

- St. Peter continued to show it's adaptability by finding ways to gather er safely under CDC guidelines. Live streaming worship continued throughout, and remains a strong part of St. Peter's mission moving forward.
- In May St. Peter made the difficult decision to close Small Miracles preschool. It had been a valuable ministry for children and families for many years, and for this we give thanks. The need in the community for this

- ministry, however, was no longer as great; and it was time to redirect St. Peter's energy and resources elsewhere. Sometimes the end or pause of one ministry allows another to spring forth. We wait and pray for what God might have in store next for St. Peter.
- 3. Renewal Leave: Grant funding allowed me to take three months over the summer focusing on rest, renewal and learning. For this I am ever grateful! The grant not only covered my expenses, but funds for the church to cover various expenses due to my absence. The learning aspect, both for myself and congregation, focused on hospitality, a theme that we have continued to learn and grow in over the year. Along these lines, St. Peter was hospitable in welcoming 10 new families to it's mission in 2022.
- 4. Fall we returned to the usual worship and education schedule. In person

worship numbers have not returned to where they were pre COVID; however, there are a couple important things to note. The first is that our online ministry expanded. Many shut-ins and others are able to join us for worship online. Also, many visitors first join us online before coming in person, making it an important evangelism tool. If you include both in person and online worshipers, we are equal or above where we were pre COVID. The second thing to note is the number of children returning to worship and education. These numbers are higher than pre COVID numbers. Considering the majority of churches across the USA are struggling with few to no children, this is a blessing for St. Peter to celebrate.

5. Choir: COVID protocols were extremely tough on this ministry. They showed their adaptability as much as any ministry. They persevered, and this past fall they were back to the usual Sunday schedule singing strong. They also ended the year with a fantastic cantata. The final song even included the tone chimes, which was something that had begun during COVID when we weren't singing. (Wait ... what was that about when one thing ends or pauses, something new springs forth.)

These are only a few highlights, because there are way too many ministries to say something about all of them. Reflecting on these allows us to see that St. Peter Lutheran church has much to celebrate and look forward to in 2023. Indeed the future looks bright!

I'm looking forward to where the Holy Spirit leads us in the coming year. Thanks for your partnership in sharing the Good News of God's love for the world made known to us in Jesus Christ. After all, that's what all of this is about. St. Peter exists as a place to share in this Good News, and to allow this Good News to spread throughout the world.


Valentine's Spaghetti Supper Feb. 5



HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING - DECEMBER 12, 2022

Pastor's Report:

- Hospitality: It's really important...Not because we want to make sure visitors choose our church over another,
 or because we need to be the biggest church around. It's important because the Spirit has led them to our
 church. Last two Wednesday and Sunday's we've had good discussions on hospitality. I'm looking forward to
 the discussions still to come.
- Memorial service for Jo Tosh was held on November 12th at St. Peter.
- Worked with Jill in putting together a "Welcome to St. Peter" video. We did a long one introducing people to the building and what to expect if they show up. This is posted on the website and on our Youtube space. A short welcome video was also made for the beginning of the livestream to welcome and invite people to join us for Christmas Eve worship online or in person at 4, 6 or 9 pm.
- We also worked on two different postcards. When I say "we", I mean we discussed it and she worked her magic in putting it together. One postcard we'll give members to hand out and invite friends, colleagues or neighbors to Christmas Eve worship. The second one is a card to hand out at Christmas Eve worship saying something like, "Thanks for joining us for worship. Join us in 2023 with some of these ministries...a number of ministries are listed.
- Enjoyed leading one MS youth group with Jill last month while Matt was out of town. Fun group of youth...they have a lot of energy.
- I have also talked with Matt about the mission trip, and plan on attending this year.
- Great seeing all the kids lead yesterday in worship. Looking forward to the confirmation students leading this Wednesday at worship, and the Cantata next Sunday.
- Began coaching Ashton's basketball team with Grimes Park and Rec. We will have one evening practice during the week and one game on Saturday's for the next couple months.

Faith Formation Report—Jill Capps

- Hospitality/Welcome:
- I recorded a welcome video from Pastor Mark that I have posted to our website and YouTube channel. I will record a second video of Pastor Mark inviting people to join us for Christmas Eve worship.
- I created a "Join us for Christmas Eve" card that will be available for members to pick up and share with friends, neighbors, co-workers, etc. I also created a "Thank you for Joining Us" card that will be handed out following Christmas Eve services with our worship schedule on the front and our upcoming events on the back
- I will create a video of the Sunday School children singing that will be shared during our Christmas Eve worship services.
- Misc.:
- Choir has been having issues with the CD player in the sanctuary, so I have spent some time troubleshooting and ultimately selecting a new component CD player to replace it. A St. Peter family that chooses to remain anonymous has generously donated the funds to purchase this.
- I will be adding additional information about giving options to our weekly live-stream email and slides at the request of our Stewardship committee.
- Faith Formation:
- We held our 2nd annual Gingerbread House build on Sunday, Dec. 4 following 10:30 worship. We had 24 families in attendance.
- The Thursday afternoon Bible study began meeting in October. At our November meeting, we decided to meet twice a month beginning in January, so we will meet the 2nd and 4th Thursdays at 1:00-2:30 p.m. We have had between 9 and 13 people attend the study.
- Confirmation:
- We will finish our study on Martin Luther & the Small Catechism in November and will begin our study on the Life of Jesus. The youth will present the Christmas Story during the Wednesday, December 14th worship service.
- For their November & December service project the youth are focusing on a project with the Grimes Store-

house. The students are collecting change and supplies for Christmas morning breakfast and to fill stockings for the youth whose families receive support from the Storehouse.

- Creation Station: Creation station continues to be well attended. We will not have Creation Station during the Cantata, Christmas Eve, or Christmas day; instead, I will provide an activity that the children can take into worship with them.
- Soundboard—Wednesday: Special thanks to Joe Johnston & Family, and Amy Short for running soundboard on Wednesday evenings for worship.
- Livestream—Sunday:
- The live-stream service continues to be offered at 8:00am services. We continue to have a steady number of people who view the service online regularly or when they are unable to attend in person. You may notice some of the video appears grainier than usual, this is due to the lighting in the sanctuary. Our camera system relies on balanced light, we should see an improvement when the burned-out lightbulbs in the sanctuary are replaced.
- "Free Advertisement/Publicity for St. Peter" Just another reminder to please follow our St. Peter Facebook page & like our posts this is the cheapest (it's free) and easiest way (just click) to spread the word about the great things happening at St. Peter. Each time you click on a post, like a post, or share a post, it increases the number of people who see our posts. Such an easy way to encourage people to visit or remind those we haven't seen in a while, why St. Peter is such an amazing church.

Youth Report

- Middle school Youth Group met twice during November. I led one gathering, and Pastor Mark and Jill covered
 for me while I was on vacation. I am grateful for Jill leadership in helping me on Wednesday nights with our
 large group.
- High school Youth Group met three times during the month of November. We had a devotion night, game night and Friendsgiving.
- I held a Mission Trip informational meeting in November. I expect 50+ youth to join us next summer. I also
 have more parents interested than I have ever have. We will begin our monthly Mission Trip meetings in January.
- December will include traditional Youth Group gatherings, participating in caroling and hold our Christmas parties for each group. We will take a holiday break beginning December 22nd, and will resume with middle school Youth Group on January 4th.

Treasurer's Report:

- Tax forms were sent to claim an Employee Retention Credit for almost \$32,000 based on two quarters of payroll taxes in 2021; this was prepared by the Timmins, Jacobsen & Strawhacker, LLP accounting firm and will likely take many weeks to receive the payment.
- October and November Financials were approved

Budget Discussion: Discussion of the 2023 budget for presentation to the congregation **Stewardship:**

• The Committee shared the binder with time & talent sheets received for identifying volunteers; shared the need for Christmas eve offering tellers. Thank you letters are going out for pledge drive – 74 pledges out of about 215 households in the church – total pledged is higher than 2021.

• Cake reception on 11/13 with Bishop Current went well; the committee is looking at a welcoming activity and

handing out candy canes with a note for Christmas eve and looking at Council members to hand these out after each service. They have an appointment later this week with the church directory representative and hope to outline and proof soon.

Worship & Music:

A new CD player has been purchased for the Sanctuary. It was installed and works great! It was given as a donation from a member who wishes to remain anonymous. A new ear and mouthpiece for pastor's mic has been ordered. It had been shorting out. We are still looking for a new host coordinator.

Old Business:

City update for James St/11 St. extension project: Amy shared that Alex Pfaltzgraff from the City of Grimes presented first
drafts of site plan options for the church to Pastor Mark, Benji Rouse, Mike Martin, Amy & Billi on 12/5. He will update the
plans with the group's feedback and share updated plans and provide a purchase agreement. Council will review in January
with a detailed update to the congregation in February.

New Business:

• Executive Committee Members/ Officer Vote: Danielle Rusch has requested that a replacement be found for her position as Vice President. Eric Soults was approved by Council to serve as Vice President through July 2025 on the Executive rather than the Stewardship Committee. He and Andrew have reached out for a Stewardship Committee replacement and hope to have someone in place for the January meeting.
