### From the Desk of Pastor Mark:

The season of Lent is 40 days, although technically it lasts for 46 days. Why? That's because Sundays are not considered part of Lent. Sundays are considered "resurrection" days, as we proclaim the Good News of God's love for us in Jesus, who is risen. The season of Lent is a time of self-reflection and repentance. There are many more nuances I could get into over the history and practices of Lent, but I'll leave it at the basics for now. One positive aspect of Lent lasting the 40 (46) days is that researchers tell us that is around the time needed to form new habits. Perhaps this is the year a new faith habit is formed for you.

This year for Lent we will be exploring

the theme: Unfinished: Discovering God's Call in the Not Yet. You can look at my article in last month's Voice to get an explanation of this theme. This month I'd like to invite you to ponder how you might be able to incorporate this theme into your own practices. This theme incorporates a spiritual practice called Vocare. Vocare is a practice designed to help you discover and embrace various ways that God calls you in everyday life, so that you may live life with intentionality for the common good.




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### Lenten Devotional

### HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING FEBRUARY 9, 2023

### Pastor's Report:

- 2023 is off to a good start. Ministries are all up and running at full speed. At a recent staff meeting we all agreed a highlight of the year was getting back to "normal" in Fall/Winter with our various ministries. Yes, it is good to be gathering together again without different restrictions.
- Spent time in January preparing for the season of Creation, which is in early February. We are in the second week of this season.
- Lent preparation has begun as well, which starts mid February. The theme for Lent this year is titled "Unfinished: Discovering God's Call in the Not Yet". Each week will have a different area of focus around this theme. A drama was found for Wednesday worship called "Love in the Time of Lent." Co-directors are in place as well.
- I've led a few of the adult ed. classes Sunday mornings. We'll focus the class on the same theme as worship for Season of Creation and our Lent theme. The class offers opportunities to dig a little deeper, and to have good discussions.
- We welcomed 3 new families to our church last Sunday.
- I've been volunteer coaching Ashton's basketball team for the Grimes Parks and Rec. It's been fun, and always a good way to meet more people in the community. We have 2 weeks left.
- Look forward to the continued discussions with council on "Becoming a Welcoming Church"

### Faith Formation Report—Jill Capps

- <u>Confirmation</u>: The youth will focus on the Passion story during confirmation beginning in February throughout Lent. During Lent the youth will meet with their small groups and share a meal before attending worship together.
- <u>Creation Station</u>: Creation station continues to be well attended. Activities will focus on creation during February's creation Sundays. Lent related activities will be available for kids to work on during Lenten suppers & during worship as there will not be creation station on Wednesday evenings.
- Thursday Afternoon Bible Study: We continue to have a great group of people attending Bible study on Thursday afternoons. Attendees are both members

- and non-members of St. Peter. This Bible study is open to all; I encourage anyone to join us if you are looking for a fun, relaxed Bible study.
- MLK Day of Service Breakfast Casseroles: On Martin Luther King Jr weekend, members of St. Peter prepared 83 casseroles for the Salvation Army's mobile breakfast canteen. We had members of all ages participate in this activity.
- 10th Annual Fleece Blanket Project: Everyone is invited to join us for our congregation wide blanket tying event on Sunday, February 26th, between worship services. Allison Newman and I met with Sunday school students on Jan 29th to introduce the project. The kids created poster boards that will be used to "advertise" the project. In addition, the kids created "commercials" that will begin appearing on Facebook over the next couple weeks to bring attention to the project. We still need donations of fabric & monetary donations to purchase fabric. Please watch Facebook & eNews for more information on how you can help with this project.
- Middle School Youth Group: I continue to stay for Middle School Youth group on Wednesday evenings, which allows Matt and I to split the kids into a couple groups to allow for conversation and connections. I am grateful for the opportunity to meet with the kids in a relaxed & fun atmosphere.
- <u>Updated Bulletin Board:</u> Education requested use of the service board and provided information for signup sheets for the Service bulletin in fellowship hall, so I have updated the board to allow for those. In addition, I updated the service project section & printed pictures of highlights of Sunday school & service opportunities for the board. VBS information will be added, and information will be rotated to reflect current service opportunities.
- <u>Creation Videos:</u> Members submitted pictures of creation (land) that I put into a slide show that will be shown during our Wednesday service on Feb 8th and the Sunday service on Feb 12th. It is fun to see God's creation through the eyes of our members through pictures that are meaningful to them.
- Technology Updates: There have been some issues related to signal strength and interference in the sanctuary. These issues have affected the wireless microphones and the projector. My first attempt was to replace some cords as I thought they may have been worn, but that does not appear to have fixed the problem. I am now looking at LED interference with the wireless signals.

#### **Youth Report**

- Middle school Youth Group only met twice during January. We held our postposed Christmas gift exchange and had Wednesday night activities cancelled due to weather on January 18<sup>th</sup>.
- High school Youth Group met three times during the month of January. We held two devotion nights and a meal night. We used our Youth Group time on the 29<sup>th</sup> for a spaghetti dinner planning meeting.
- We held our first two Mission Trip meetings for youth and Chaperones on January 15<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>. We participated in some get to know you activities and did some planning for the spaghetti dinner.
- Looking forward into the month of February, we will hold our traditional Youth Group meetings for middle school and high school groups. We will also hold our annual Valentine's Day spaghetti dinner on February 5<sup>th</sup>. We also have a scheduled Mission Trip meeting February 26.

#### Worship & Music:

 Rita Rosenberg and Carol Miller are co-directing the Lenten dramas again; the sanctuary piano says it needs a new battery and Kaarin talked to a tech person - these pianos usually last about 20 years. She and Bradley are going to change the batteries and the piano is about 22 years old - it is well-maintained so we hope to have 5 more years based on her conversation with the tech.

#### **Old Business:**

- Outreach event no update yet but Evangelism will follow-up to see what could be coordinated with the Faith Formation Director for the Easter egg hunt to invite the community into our building.
- Fall Retreat follow-up -
- Signage: Signage: Council discussed various signs to consider updating inside and outside group agreed to try out a guest parking sign and put in signs for the Handicap parking spots. Indoor signage includes a "K-12, Library, Choir" sign for the left hallway. Signage for "Church Office", "Pastor" and "Restrooms" is also being considered along with a stenciled "Coffee & Fellowship" sign in the fellowship area. This would be a start to addressing signage as we consider more ways that St. Peter can show hospitality.
- Empty Nester Group we need more follow-up on this next month
- Small group ideas: Encouraging households to sign up for group meals/gatherings with signup in March timeframe and to meet a few times this year. Staff will help with signups.

# HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE SEMI-ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING FEBRUARY 12, 2023

- Approval of agenda, July Semi
   Annual Meeting Minutes, and 2022 Annual Report
- Presentation and approval of 2022 Annual Financial Audit: The Audit Committee consisted of Max Bodermann & Bradley Fasse - Amy read their report stating that the church's finances are in good order.
- Old Business: 11th St/James St update The City of Grimes wants to connect James Street to 11th St to the south of the church; the City's design for this is to include a roundabout through the intersection. The current driveway would only allow for a right-in/rightout option since it would be too close to the roundabout. The City provided an option for a longer curved driveway that wraps around the current sign. Parking could be added around that driveway at the time it is put it or in the future. We provided future plans for the church that were previously drawn by architects so that we could see how church expansion to the west would look with the expanded road. The City is proposing a purchase agreement where they obtain an appraisal on land to be taken from the church and the corresponding easements and then deduct improvements for the driveway. Stormwater retention and lighting are issues to consider as we look at an extended driveway moved to the north. We need to consider how we want to respond and whether to get our own appraisal and how we want to factor in sidewalks and the crosswalk from the South Sports Complex. Some improvements may be more efficient to do now rather than later and maintenance costs of lighting and driveway would be greater. The Executive Committee, Benji Rouse, Heath Picken and Mike Martin will meet to review the factors and proposal from the City. A future congregational meeting will be needed to authorize Council to sell real estate to the City and grant easements.
- New Business:
- Discussion and Approval of 2023 Proposed Budget
- Tree project update We need to remove the 2nd round of the ash trees for approx. \$6,000 and there is a proposal of up to \$2,500 to plant. There are no plans to plant yet and many options will be considered. It may be delayed as Council considers how the lawn will be impacted by the 11th St. road expansion.

- Small Miracles: The preschool checking account is closed and the income statement showed a loss for 2022 in the preschool fund since the grants from 2021 carried the 2022 expenses. The Multi-Purpose room has been prepared for painting by PJ Short. This will be completed in the coming weeks.
- Staff wage increase/Stipend expansion: The proposed budget included 4% increases for staff wages. Discussion included a request from the congregation to delineate the role of the Sunday School curriculum coordinator from the Education Committee members.

The Congregation thanked Sarah Capps and Katie Murano for taking these roles for the first time in 2022 and their excellent work and time involved.

- Employee Retention Credit Amy shared that ERC funds will be received from the IRS once they process our tax paperwork.
- The Congregation thanked Chad Wyllie for his dilgence in overseeing the church's financial records and putting together the proposed budget again this year.
- Next Semi-Annual meeting date: July 9, 2023
- Potential for a special meeting regarding city expansion project

- Amy Dikkut purchased stamps prior to the postage increase and WELCA will reimburse.
- Purchasing and delivering a gift to some of our church family unable to come to in-person church was dis-

- cussed. Kellie Heiken-Stoops is exploring possibilities.
- The possibility of holding a winter clothing drive in the spring when the last season's gloves/hats/mittens are being put away for the year. People may want to donate items that have been outgrown. These items could help meet the needs of some children in our community that may otherwise go without. WELCA board members will reach out to school guidance counselors and/or school nurses to determine the logistics.
- Other ideas for future discussions; WELCA sponsored speakers on topics of interest to women in our church family; WELCA sponsoring the Little Pantry or encouraging other groups to do so.
