Last month I mentioned how the church chose to invest in the Sunday school ministry by hiring someone to develop the lesson plans, and I shared how that investment paid off through the joy and learning that took place this past Sunday school year. I wasn't here, as I was on Renewal Leave; but I have heard nothing but glowing remarks about the job she did. We don't always get to see how seeds of faith planted and watered grow and flourish. It's good to see how Kaitlyn has flourished, and we're thankful she is sharing her gifts and faith with the VBS ministry. Ben Brushaber plans to attend Iowa State University and major in Agronomy/Seed Science.








Jacob Fistler plans to major in Business and Finance. He plans to wrestle in college.

- Synod Assembly is next Monday and Tuesday. It is on Zoom this year, so I won't need to travel anywhere, but will still be occupied on those days.
- Was good to have the kids sing at 10:30 worship on Sunday. Thankful for Jill and Carol Eilers to step in and lead the youth on short notice. We've learned a lot about being flexible and adapting over the last few years.
- Mother's Day and senior recognition on this Sunday and Confirmation Sunday on the 21st. So, we finish our program year in May with some fun Sundays.
- Memorial Day to Labor Day we move to one 9:00 am worship.

Faith Formation Report—Jill Capps

- Confirmation: Our final night of confirmation with the 7th & 8th graders was on May 3rd; we celebrated with a night of games & activities. Several of the youth then stayed for our Middle school youth group pizza night. I've enjoyed attending middle school youth group this year it's fun to hang out with the kids separate from the more formal confirmation setting. Matt does a great job with the kids we're lucky to have him at St. Peter.
- On May 10th I met with the 6th graders and parents for confirmation orientation. This will be a smaller class, with about 9 students, I am excited to have them as part of our confirmation program.
- On May 17th I will meet with our 8th graders, guides & parents to celebrate & prepare for the affirmation of baptism service on May 21st. The youth will share faith statements and we will rehearse the worship service. This year we have 15 youth who will affirm their faith. A huge thanks to the guides who have journeyed with the youth for 2 years: Josie McClure, Abbey Witt, Sarah Hughes, Cindy Kreklau, Katie Scholl, and Erica Davis.
- Thursday Afternoon Bible Study: We will finish our study on Proverbs in May. Those who attend the study have requested that we continue meeting through the summer, so we will continue meeting on the 2nd and 4th Thursdays of the month at 1:00pm.

- Anyone who is interested in a relaxed, fun study is welcome to join us. The readings for the study can be found on our website.
- Small Groups: Pastor and I met to divide those who
 are signed up into small groups. We will be reaching
 out soon to share that information. We are excited to
 have these groups up and running, it will be a great
 way for our members to connect with one another.
- Technology: A service tech from Iowa Audio Visual will at church soon to help resolve the issue we are having with the projector. It sounds like it should be a quick fix.
- VBS: I met with Katie Murano regarding VBS to answer a few questions and discuss the rotation schedules. She has done a great job once again getting everything organized, and I anticipate another fun year for all. Please consider signing up as a volunteer, and don't forget to sign your kids up as campers.
- CFUM: We will try to do another CFUM casserole or meal prep over the summer. When we went down in April to serve the meal that the confirmation students prepared, I learned that they are still struggling to find enough churches & other groups to provide meals. The CFUM staff are often left to prepare the meals themselves. In addition, since COVID they've been serving all meals "to-go" so they have the added cost of providing to go containers. Beginning in mid-May they will test returning to indoor meal, sitdown meal service once a week, with the hopes of adding additional days later in the summer. They continue to need bottled water as well especially during the hot summer months. I continue to be impressed by this organization and the services they provide to their community.

Youth Report

- Middle school Youth Group resumed again on April 19th. It was good to get the middle schoolers together after our pause during Lent.
- High school Youth Group met four times during the month of April. We held devotion nights on April 2nd, April 23rd, and April 30th. We held a meal night at the Food Depot on April 16th. Also, we did not meet on April 9th due to Easter.
- We held a Mission Trip meeting for our youth and parents on Sunday, April 30th. We discussed all things fundraising. During our Easter breakfast fundraiser, we raised just under \$700.
- In May, middle school Youth Group will meet for the final time on May 3rd with a pizza party and game

night. High school Youth Group will meet twice during the month. We will host our Senior night BBQ on May 7th. We will not meet on Mother's Day, or over the Memorial Day weekend.

Treasurer's Report:

- Approval of March & April Financials
- Council members shared the financials through April
 with the Congregation on 5/7 and will do so on 5/14
 to make sure that we catch more people in church.
 Eric recorded a video that Lauri sent to the congregation in between those Sundays. The goal is to reduce
 our YTD shortfall going into the summer where inperson attendance tends to drop.
- Billi reported that we completed the report and accounting with the Clergy Renewal Program as a requirement of receiving the funds for Pastor's Renewal leave in summer 2022; the report documents need to be kept two years in case of an audit by the Lilly Endowment.

Stewardship:

 Life Serve can not hold a blood drive during the youth car wash on June 17th at the church. Instead, the committee will try to find a date for the blood drive in the fall.

Building & Grounds

- Todd replaced the defibrillator next to the host table and he will send out the website instructions to Council members
- Todd ordered the garage door.
- Carol Clarke and Tim talked about possible plant ideas and then they'll follow-up with Boy Scouts so Alex (the Scout) can propose a plan layout and watering; to support their fundraising of cans, we want to encourage the congregation to donate cans to their buckets at Fareway. Tim is meeting with Kim Dreher with the Valley Disaster Relief organization to see if their organization is a good option for the remaining tree removal.

Education:

- Destiny brought a bin to put toys in when they have been played with and then a youth volunteer will wash these regularly
- Education will review with Jill how the Sunday School year went and what could be altered for next year.
- Katie is working on VBS registrations and volunteers.

Evangelism:

- Senior cake reception is this Sunday.
- The church directory is expected to ship on or before May 25th
- Signed up for Governor's Day parade on June 10th the committee requests a pick-up truck and people to walk with the float and will reach out to find volunteers.
- The 4th of July fireworks can be watched on our lawn again with a free will offering for the snacks/water visitors often want to donate for the snacks and restroom usage.
- Rob to look into the Grimes farmers market to see what vendor costs are now that it's on Saturdays starting June 3rd at Heritage Park along NE Beaverbrooke.

Worship & Music:

- Pastor and Jill to do videos on volunteer positions over the summer
- Sept 10th we go back to 2 services; Sept 13th is first Wednesday service; intinction for communion to be used over the summer.
- The committee is proposing a new staff position for a children's choir director that would go alongside Emily Wells who is responsible for the adult choir. This youth position would be outside of Sunday School and not during Sunday School time likely afternoon or evening practice weekly. Discussed practices after church as a trial period this summer with a 3-mo stipend for K-6th grade students. We may have a person already interested in the position. Motion approved for a \$500 summer stipend to try out a children's choir director and gauge interest
