

# From the Desk of Pastor Mark:

This past Memorial Day weekend I flew to Virginia for my Uncle Jim's memorial service. Before he died, he told my cousin that he wanted me to do the memorial service. I was humbled and honored with the request, but I'd never done a memorial service for a family member before. I've done several family weddings, but never a memorial service. After some prayerful discernment, including chatting with their local pastor, I agreed. I worked out with their pastor (who, by the way, is a great guy and wonderful pastor) that I would lead the memorial service; and then when we left the sanctuary I would take off my alb and stole to join my family. At that point he had his alb and stole on, and led the congregation to the columbarium for the committal service. It worked out well. My Uncle was an important positive influence in

my life, and I'm thankful for the opportunity to be a part of celebrating his life and commending him to God's eternal care.

My reason for sharing this has to do with what the pastor said to me following the service. He said, among other things, something like, "I really appreciate your message being all Gospel." This might not come as much of a surprise to those who've heard me preach a memorial service, but I suppose in Virginia it might come as a breath of fresh air. In Lutheran theology there is an important distinction between law and gospel. One way to think about it, in overly simplified terms to be sure, is that the law tells us what we should be doing and the gospel tells us what Christ has done for us. Perhaps you've been to a memorial service where the preacher shares some positive qualities of the deceased

# Prayer Ministry Team July 30

Once a month, we meet in person to pray together for those who have requested prayers through the prayer chain or other requests. It is a chance to spend time in prayer, get updates, and send notes to those the group prays for. You don't have to be comfortable praying aloud to participate! Join us in the library after worship at about 10:00 a.m. and tells everyone this is the example they should follow. Other times perhaps the preacher shares so many of the deceased good Christian qualities that it's as if they are trying to preach the person into heaven, or trying to convince everyone that the deceased deserves to be in heaven. These would fall under the distinction of the "law," as they are focusing on the person's work. Gospel focuses on Christ's work through the cross and resurrection. To be clear, I believe celebrating the deceased person's life, lifting up their good qualities, and sharing how they may have touched people's lives for the better is an important part of memorial services. (Aspects of this were incorporated into my Uncle's service to be sure.) I also believe the most important part of a memorial service is proclaiming what Christ has done for us through his death and resurrection. It's not my good deeds or good Christian living that earns me salvation. It's God's work in Christ Jesus that does that. Proclaiming what God has done for us in Jesus Christ is what we term "gospel."

At my Uncle's service I shared something he told me many years ago while we were watching golf. He said, "You know, everybody misses. It's just a matter of degrees." He was speaking of golf at the time, but the phrase stuck with me for years as I applied it to life. To miss means I tried. To miss means I put myself out there. To miss means I gave it my best shot. As I learned about law and gospel theology I realized it applies as well. The Apostle Paul said in the third chapter of Romans, "all sin and fall short of the glory of God." In other words, all miss in trying to live the perfect Christian life. Paul follows this up with beautiful words of gospel though by saying, "and all are justified freely through his grace that came through the redemption of Christ Jesus." We may miss in trying to live up to God's standards, or the "law." God does not miss though. God hit the mark for us in the life, death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ. This is the Gospel. Gospel translated means Good News. God's love for us in Jesus Christ is indeed Good News. It's this Good News that frees us to keep trying, keep putting ourselves out there and to keep giving life our best shot. We'll certainly miss at times in living up to the glory of God; but I believe we'll also hit when we do our best to love God, and to love the people and world that God so loves. As my uncle said, "Everybody misses," but to miss means that we're living. Hopefully as we grow, the "matter of degrees" that we miss gets narrower and narrower. Either way, the Gospel remains. God's love for us is steadfast. God does not miss. Thanks be to God for this Good News!



- General Fund—May 2023, income was more than monthly expenses, thus it finished with a gain of \$44,877.84
- General Fund YTD—May 2023, income was greater than expenses, thus it finished with a gain of \$22,376.21.

\*Income for May includes the IRS check for an employee retention credit of approximately \$35,000.00. These funds have been moved to our contingency savings.

## HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING JUNE 8, 2023

#### Pastor's Report:

- May is a busy time at St. Peter, as we wrap up the "program" ministry for the year. SS end of year carnival, kids singing in worship, graduate recognition, and confirmation Sunday were all joyous occasions for the community of faith.
- 15 youth affirmed their baptisms in worship on Sunday, May 21st. On May 10th there was a Confirmation orientation to welcome the new students to confirmation in the coming year. I went to this meeting not only as pastor but parent this time, as Kadin will be entering 7th grade confirmation next year. My first year having one of my own kids in confirmation. A fun first!
- Synod Assembly was online this year, which I participated in on May 15-16.
- Participated in the DCG HS Baccalaureate service on May 24th. Matt Schmidt and I were both there, and prayed with the senior graduates. Great to see several youth from St. Peter participating in leading the service at the HS.
- Memorial Day weekend I flew to Virginia for my Uncle's memorial service. I worked with the local pastor in organizing and leading the worship. Was grateful for the Missouri Synod Lutheran church welcoming me, and being so helpful and gracious to work with. First family memorial that I have led, and it went well.
- Planning to walk in the parade on Saturday. If you're available, come walk.
- Sounds like the prayer tent at the Farmer's market went well last weekend. I'm planning on taking Saturday, June 24th to be there.

#### Faith Formation Report—Jill Capps

- **Confirmation:** On May 17th, I met with our 8th graders, guides & parents to celebrate & prepare for the affirmation of baptism. On May 21st, 15 youth affirmed their faith. A huge thanks to the guides who have journeyed with the youth for 2 years: Josie McClure, Abbey Witt, Sarah Hughes, Cindy Kreklau, Katie Scholl, and Erica Davis. A special thanks to Destiny for her help in setting up Fellowship Hall for the affirmation service and to Rob & Monti for serving the breakfast & making coffee on the 21st.
- Thursday Afternoon Bible Study: This summer we will study the book of Acts (spread over our 6

meetings) and continue meeting on the 2nd and 4th Thursdays of the month at 1:00pm. Anyone who is interested in a relaxed, fun study is welcome to join us. The readings for the study can be found on our website. We have both St. Peter members and nonmembers attend our study. I have enjoyed getting to know everyone and spending time having great, thought-provoking discussions.

- Small Groups: Our fellowship small groups will begin meeting this summer. Pastor and I divided the 24 couples into 6 small groups, with one "leader" per group. We are excited for this ministry to begin. We hope that each group will have the opportunity to meet at least 4 times over the next few months.
- Technology: Iowa Audio Visual came out a couple weeks ago and fixed the projector. As suspected, one of our transmitters needed to be replaced due to normal wear & tear. They also spent some time looking into pastor's wireless microphone and were also unable to recreate the glitch that sometimes occurs on Sunday mornings during the Children's sermon. They have suggested that we may need an extender for the antenna to be placed under the altar or pulpit, or perhaps in the ceiling. (A special, although late thankyou, to Brad Fasse, Tim Schiller, and Matt Schmidt for replacing the speaker in the sanctuary.)
- VBS: Katie has done a great job planning VBS, her experience from last year has been a huge benefit. We have met a couple times to discuss VBS and will meet again this week. Council members if you are available, it would be great to have you walk with the St. Peter float during the Governor's Days parade. Thank you to Brad Fasse & Nate Estes for putting the VBS sign up prior to Governor's Days!
- Communication: I have spent the past several weeks making some updates to our website. If you have anything that you would like added, such as special information related to your ministry team, please let me know. Thanks to Destiny for speaking about this at one of your prior council meetings. Our website is a great way to connect with not only current, but potential members & visitors to St. Peter. Posting current & upcoming events helps to show the many ways that people can become involved at St. Peter.
- Volunteer Videos: Pastor and I will put together a few videos to post to the website, eNews, and possibly Facebook that will help explain some of our volunteer roles. We will work on these videos this summer so that they are ready to go prior to the new ministry year.

# JUNE 1, 2023

- The ladies summer social in June will be held at the Schlenkers on June 16 from 6:00 to 08:30 or so. Details decided at last month's meeting were confirmed. Carol will bring the Washers game. Kellie is sending out the invite in FaceBook and will do something for the e-news and bulletins. WELCA is providing the food and guests need only bring their own drinks and chairs.
- No changes with plans for Mosaic. Ellie will deliver bubbles, balls and a snack to Mosaic June 3. Future plans for Mosaic are:
