August is Back-to-School Scholarships Month for Myamba Lutheran Parish

During August—back-to-school month in Iowa—St. Peter also focuses on our companion congregation in Tanzania, Myamba Lutheran Parish. Our emphasis is on the secondary school scholarship program for certain Myamba students attending the four years of public secondary school—those whose families need financial support in order to afford to send their children to school.

A \$100 annual scholarship provides a school uniform, socks and shoes, hot lunch, school fees, testing fees, and school security. Sponsors can also give \$15 to cover the cost of a Swahili Bible for a first-year scholarship student and a notebook and pen given to each scholarship recipient. Scholarship sponsors are partners with students' parents in providing for their education.

95 students are receiving annual scholarships for the 2023 calendar year school year through St. Peter's program. Let's match that number for the 2024 school year beginning January 2024!!

Hear all about it! You'll learn more about this program and how you can help during brief Myamba Moments at the beginning of each worship service in August. We'll show pictures of the schools, feature two fourth-year students who describe their typical school day, and hear from the five recent graduates who are continuing their education at high schools around the country. Pledge cards are provided. Pledge payments can be placed in the offering plates, in the baskets on the information table, received online, or mailed to the office.

St. Peter's Additional Supports of Myamba Lutheran Parish

While St. Peter's Secondary School Scholarship Program has the most widespread impact on students and families of Myamba Lutheran Parish, St. Peter conducts additional programs to benefit children and families of Myamba. These programs are:

- Scholarships for Myamba students with hearing impairments to attend Mwanga School for the Deaf, a ministry of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania. Four young children of Myamba Parish are now attending Mwanga. St. Peter Sunday school offerings pay a portion of the costs.
- Medical support for young children of Myamba Parish affected by what we understand to be excess, naturallyoccurring fluoride in the drinking water that causes bowed legs. This condition can be surgically corrected or, in less severe cases, corrected with leg braces. Since 2011, two Myamba children have had surgery and two have received braces. A fifth Myamba child, Agness, received corrective surgery in June at a Tanzanian hospital, performed by Sioux City, Iowa orthopedic surgeon, Dr. Steve Meyer, through the non-profit he co-founded— Siouxland Tanzania Educational Medical Ministries.
- Contributing St. Peter confirmation offerings toward Myamba confirmation program expenses for curriculum and Bibles. A recent Myamba confirmation class had 104 students.
- Providing education expense support for post-secondary students seeking higher education or vocational training. Requests have been handled on a case by case basis as fund surpluses allow.
- An annual gift of \$2,500 from St. Peter to Myamba, provided by offerings through a General Fund line item. Gifts are used for building projects or parish-wide expenses.
- Occasional financial gifts to nearby Gonja Lutheran Hospital, operated by the Pare Diocese, of which Myamba Parish is a member.

\$100 provides an annual scholarship for a student of Myamba Lutheran Parish, St. Peter's Tanzanian companion. \$100 covers approximately half of the costs to attend school for the year: tuition, school uniforms (shirt/slacks/ sweaters for boys; blouse/skirt/sweater for girls), shoes, socks, school supplies, hot lunch, etc.

An additional \$15 will provide a Swahili Bible for a first-year scholarship student, as well as a school notebook and pen, thus giving tangible items while also addressing the student's spiritual needs.

In this way, St. Peter's scholarship program partners with students' parents/guardians to help pay for the education of students most in need of financial assistance, as identified by Myamba's companionship committee, pastor and parish evangelists.

- *Income for 2023 includes the IRS check for an employee retention credit of approximately \$35,000.00. These funds have been moved to our contingency savings.

- The parade during Governor's Days went well. Thanks to the Jacksons for driving their truck, and to the many volunteers that walked and helped pass out treats and invites to VBS. We had a large group of St. Peter folks walking this year, which was great!
- Synod Assembly was online this year, which I participated in on May 15-16.
- Just finished up another fabulous week of VBS. Thanks to all the many volunteers who helped make it such a success. It takes a lot of people to pull off a great event like this. Thankful for all the people that shared their gifts!
- Matt Schmidt and I were at the St. Peter "booth" at the Farmers Market a couple Saturday's ago. We met

 and interacted with a number of people from the community, shared information on St. Peter, and had a couple of prayer requests. Monti and Carol were there this past Saturday.
- Met a couple more times with the team negotiating with the city on road expansion. Great to have a variety of gifts in that group sharing their expertise.
- Met with the Myamba ministry team last Sunday. It's remarkable and inspiring the amount of financial support St. Peter has been able to provide our brothers and sisters in Christ at Myamba Lutheran Parish for the last 12 years. This coming August will again be the month to highlight the scholarship ministry with Myamba. During this time the team will also share some of the ways St. Peter has supported Myamba.
- Attended the mission trip meeting and car wash this month. It will be my first time attending the youth mission trip. I'm looking forward to building relationships with the youth and adults on the trip, as we work together sharing Christ's love in service to others.

Faith Formation Report—Jill Capps

• **Confirmation:** Planning is underway for the 2023-24 confirmation year. Lessons have been selected and the calendar is tentatively completed. We will be covering The New Testament, Apostles Creed, and Lutheran Life as part of our 2nd year rotation. I am in the process of finding small group guides for the incoming 7th grade class. **Service Project** - I have con-

nected with Jacob at CFUM about a project for our confirmation students to work on during the month of September. CFUM has requested assistance providing the children in its program with books that they are able to take home and keep - essentially helping them to build at home libraries for the kids. I hope to connect with a couple of our members to obtain a Thrivent grant to help purchase some of the books. The youth will also collect change that will be used to purchase the books.

- Thursday Afternoon Bible Study: We had a great turnout for our June potluck - with about 15 people in attendance. We have had quite a few nonmembers join us for our Bible study; it has been a great way to connect with others. We are continuing our study on the book of Acts. Everyone is invited to attend the study, and the reading list can be found on our website.
- Small Groups: Small groups have been assigned and have begun meeting this summer. John and I met with our small group in June, it was great to get to connect with other St. Peter members. I am excited to hear from our small group leaders to see how the meetings have gone to date.
- VBS: I enjoyed working with Katie on VBS again this year. She did a great job and we have been lucky to have her leadership the past 2 summers. Katie will not be returning as VBS Director as she will be moving and plans to be married next summer. She has shared her working documents with me, so a new director should be able to step in and follow the format that Katie has set up.
- We had a great response to our VBS service project -LSI Immigrant and Refugee Resettlement Project. The kids collected \$1,397.35 in cash and 4 bedding tubs and 1 bathroom tub for a total of over \$1,700.00 in cash & goods. I will deliver these items to LSI on July 14. The staff at LSI is so impressed by this donation that they have asked to share our project on their Facebook & Instagram pages. Way to go VBS Heroes!
- Church Publicity: I have created a draft of the new St. Peter brochure that I will share with pastor when he returns later this week. It will be nice to have an updated brochure that we can share with visitors, and with those we meet at events such as the Farmers' Market, 4th of July, and other community events.
- Volunteers: Pastor and I will begin working on volunteer "how-to" videos next week. I have asked Kim & Micah Jackson and their family to be part of the videos so we can walk volunteers through things such as serving as hosts during offering, communion etc.

God's Work. Our Hands. Sunday: With the help of Jahn Bartelt I was able to connect with some of the staff at the Iowa Food Bank to find a project that St. Peter can participate in on Sunday, September 10th. We will create personal care packs that will be distributed by the Food Bank to Iowans in need. We will collect donations, and hopefully have a Thrivent grant to use to purchase most of the supplies. Members will then be able to assemble the kits following each worship service.

Youth Report

- In June high school Youth Group continued to meet on Sunday nights, taking off Father's Day and the Sunday of VBS.
- On June 17th we had our car wash fundraiser. We had a great morning and raised over \$1,700 from the event. The youth worked hard and we enjoyed our time together.
- As we move into July, we will gather on July 2nd, 9th, and 16th.
- July also brings us to our Mission Trip to Altoona, PA. We will depart on Saturday, July 22nd, and return on Saturday, July 29th. I look forward to our time together and am excited to grow in our faith.

Treasurer's Report:

Stewardship :

- The pledge packets to be sent to members around Sept 6-8th. Still hoping to have LifeServe around for a blood drive sometime during that annual stewardship campaign;
- The church has CDs at Bankers Trust that mature on July 23rd - the Assessment CD is over \$35,500 and the Memorial funds have \$20,000 of the total \$35,000 in a CD. Council agreed to renew the Memorial funds of \$20,000 for 9-15 months at Bankers Trust depending on the rates available at renewal; we are moving the Assessment savings into a savings or checking account going forward as we have an appraisal review expense to allocate from those funds, and we may repurpose those funds toward signs or other lawn/parking lot costs once we know what the City is covering in our purchase agreement for the sale of land to add 11th St connection.

Building & Grounds

- Trees were all removed in late June by the Valley Disaster Relief organization, and now the Eagle Scout project is in the works for replanting. Tim shared the recommendations from Carol Clarke with the Scout on about 4 trees to provide various colors at different seasons, and they will continue to collaborate on locations to avoid the street project work.
- Approved payment of \$2,144 for garage door repair from building funds and refrigerator repair of \$1.821.10 from general funds.
- We also donated \$1200 to Valley Disaster Relief (\$100/tree) and will spend around \$500 from budgeted funds to have Brady Miller come with a stump grinder and solicit Council members and other volunteers to clear the stumps. These two expenses are less than half the approved congregational budget for tree removal approved in February. Thanks to Tim for all the communication with vendors on this project!

Education:

- Carnival: August 27th for mini golf with committees each taking a hole and a bounce house, breakfast food, and snacks; Sunday School starts Sept 10th.
- Facebook: Jill encourages members to like and share the church's posts to continue to increase traffic to our Facebook page.
- Katie Murano did a great job with VBS again this year; it will be her last year and Council thanks Katie for her 2 years in this new/formalized VBS Coordinator role! We will advertise within the church again and speak with Matt Schmidt about ideas on young adults for next year. Council encourages any member to express interest to the Education Committee: Destiny Estes or Jill Capps.

Evangelism:

- July 4th fireworks 125 bags of popcorn were all consumed; we went through almost 200 bottles of water and \$109 was collected in the free will offering. People love the use of the restrooms and bug spray so donations about covered the church's costs.
- Finishing farmers market location is going well and there were a number of prayer requests (about 25 total) and interaction with kids playing bean bag. Thanks to all who did the booth this summer!
- Rob shared a hospitality team idea considering

whether a subgroup could help put together volunteers to help with sporadic events where we all wear the same St. Peter shirt and hand out brochures at events like the Governor's Day parade, 4th of July, farmers market, Sunday School carnival and possible ice cream social in addition to Sunday worship and VBS. The committee will work to figure out how to implement something like this.

Worship & Music :

• Summer reported that the two worship service schedule starts Sept. 10th, and Wednesday worship resumes Sept. 13th.

Old Business:

James St project update - The City has provided a verbal counter offer to our recent items to discuss. They have included all pavement for the 2 entrances, longer driveway and parking to the east of the new driveway and the parallel sidewalk. Executive and Building & Grounds will continue to discuss and Billi will update the congregation at Sunday's meeting.

Old Business

- Tree project update Amy shared that Valley Disaster Relief/Chainsaw Ministries removed the remaining dead ash trees, stumps to be removed by coordination from Council and an Eagle Scout project is starting with 4 trees to plant and water.
- James Street Project Update Billi shared the map again of the Clty's planned round-a-bout connecting 11th St and James Street and discussed the new 11th St. entrance to the south of the church and the proposed new entrance from James that would be moved north and curve around the sign. The City has counter offered to include around 13-14 parking spaces to the east of the driveway facing the church with a sidewalk running along it. They would deduct pavement costs from the approx \$106,000 starting value that their appraisal generated. The church paid for an appraisal review to see whether assumptions are reasonable. We discussed various guestions of members and Executive Committee will continue to discuss with Benji Rouse, who is leading negotiations with the City.
