

Pastor's Report:

- Summer ministry finished strong with Blessing of the Backpacks and the Kickoff carnival. Gave out crosses this year for the kids to attach to their backpacks. Plenty left if you want one, or your child or youth needs one.
- Carnival went great too. Good to see so many people. Couple new families, couple families haven't seen in a while, as well as many others. Good variety of activities for all ages.
- Myamba scholarships were promoted and money gathered throughout August. It went pretty well. Such a wonderful ministry.
- Fall ministries have started off well. Sunday went back to two services 8:00 and 10:30. Sunday school looked to go well also.
- I led Bible instruction last Sunday. Three year olds got their story bible. Fifth graders got the Lutheran Study Bible. I always enjoy this time with the kids and their parents.

Faith Formation Report—Jill Capps

- Confirmation: Confirmation began on September 6th with thirteen 8th graders and nine 7th graders. We will spend the first few weeks of confirmation talking about the New Testament, with focus on Pentecost & the conversion of Saul. Service & Fellowship for September: The youth will be collecting change that we will use to purchase new books for kindergarten 5th graders from Moulton Elementary in Des Moines who attend after school programming at CFUM (Children & Family Urban Movement.) We have also received a Thrivent Grant that we will use for this project as well. Thanks in large part to a Thrivent grant, we were able to complete 92 personal care bags that will be distributed by the Food Bank of lowa to those in need. I delivered the bags on Tuesday to their Des Moines location.
