The Voice



From the Desk of Pastor Mark:

"Do not focus on what you don't want to hit." I read this quote from an extreme snow skier recently. He was mainly talking about trees. You don't focus on the trees. You focus on the path you want to take through the trees. This reminded me about the verse from the Apostle Paul that we read in worship recently, "Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things." (Philippians 4:8).

Extreme skiers know that focusing on the trees will spell disaster. Instead, they focus on how to navigate their

way safely through the trees. Apostle Paul was sharing similar advice to the Philippians nearly 2000 years ago. The Philippians were a congregation of believers that the Apostle Paul had started years before. Paul has heard that they are struggling with persecution and conflict. Paul shared several encouraging words with them in his letter. He said things like "let your gentleness be known to everyone." He said, "Do not worry...but in everything...let your requests be made known to God." Then he shares the words of where to focus one's attention. Not on the things that are untrue, dishonorable, unjust, impure, and not praiseworthy. Instead, savs, "Whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of

Paul gives the advice of focusing on positive things. Focus on good things. Focus on what is God pleasing or bringing praise to God.

We are not being persecuted at St. Peter. There are plenty of challenging things going on in the world though, that draw our attention. We all face our own difficult challenges in one way or another as well. Apostle Paul gives good advice for all people. Stay focused on things that are life giving—things that are life giving for you and your neighbor.

This is the November Voice, so the Thanksgiving holiday is on the way. That's a good reminder that one important thing to be mindful of is things that we are thankful for. I give thanks to God for many things, and that includes the good people of St. Peter Lutheran Church. Thanks for being a community of faith that shares in the Good News of the Gospel together, as well as reaching out into the world sharing that same Good News.
