Which of these invitations would be the most difficult for you? I'm guessing most people would say the last one. Unless of course you hate basketball or Mexican food. Then perhaps those would be more difficult. :) Most Christians I've been around over the years though, have a hard time inviting people to worship. Why is that? Faith is very personal. I get that. There is always the fear of rejection when extending an invitation. I get that too. Religion and politics are taboo subjects for polite conversations we hear. I understand that and can see the wisdom in that at certain times for sure. Many say that they assume everyone is already Christian and has a church. This would be a wrong assumption though. Numerous studies and statistical analysis would show that this is not the case. So what makes it so difficult? When we experience things that are meaningful,

bring us joy and are important to us, we often want to invite others to share the experience. When it comes to sports, food, music, theater, etc., it seems to come more naturally to invite others to experience it as well. What is it that holds people back from sharing their faith, and inviting others to experience the Good News too? What is it that holds you back?

For me, this isn't about church numbers. It's not about increasing membership to save the church from decline, or to be the biggest church on the block. Nor is it about increasing numbers to prove that we are indeed sharing the Gospel, or as proof that the Spirit really is at work in the church. For me, it is about sharing the Good News with others. For me, it is about sharing something that is important and meaningful to me. That's what made me switch from being a teacher and coach to a pastor. My faith was something extremely important to me. I wanted others to experience the Good News as I have. I want others to find the "Peace which surpasses all understanding...which we receive from Christ Jesus." I want others to have the hope in a new tomorrow that we receive through Christ Jesus. I want others to experience the love and joy I've received through the Gospel. I didn't have to become a pastor to do this though. It is something that I felt strongly called to do. You don't have to become a pastor to share something that is important to you, like your faith, with others. Simply share what is important to you about your faith. And ... invite them to hear and experience the Good News with you at worship.

Maybe Ash Wednesday isn't your favorite, or when you first want to invite a friend. Perhaps a Wednesday soup supper with dramas and Holden Evening prayer during Lent would be better. Maybe Sunday morning worship would be better. Do what's more natural and makes sense to you. The important thing is extending an invitation. Extend an invitation for others to hear and experience the Good News too. We are only called to share the Good News. We let the Holy Spirit work from there. Sharing one's faith and extending an invitation requires vulnerability. Be strong, be bold, for Christ is with you.

<u>Worship: 6:30 p.m.</u> Wednesday Lenten worship will occur each Wednesday Feb. 14 - Mar. 20.




<u>Choir Rehearsal</u> will follow Lenten services at 7:15 p.m. All are welcome to join the choir!
